A superior who is the reason for all the venting sessions at the dinner table when you go home. When thinking about the infamous "boss" figures throughout history, my mind instantly went to legendary New York Yankees owner George Steinbrenner. Now for those that don't know much about George Steinbrenner or baseball, he basically revo-

lutionized what it meant to be an owner of a major sports franchise. Most owners have a "hand's off" approach, delegating the team operations to others, through the roles of CEO's, general managers, coaches, assistants etc. However, this description could not be further from the truth when we discuss Steinbrenner's tenure with the New York Yankees.
