The "Boss man" - Pt. 3

Throughout history there have been plenty of infamous boss figures, known for their outlandish



and often immoral behavior. Last week we profiled the man known as "The Boss" George Steinbrenner, the legendary owner of the New York Yankees. This week, I want to profile "the boss" of all crime bosses, Al Capone. Capone attained no-

toriety during the Prohibition era of the United States. He led many multi-million-dollar gambling, bootlegging operations, and other "unsavory" schemes throughout the 1920s. During his seven-year reign as the crime boss of Chicago, he quickly became the most infamous gangster in American history. A century later, the life and death of Al Capone continues to fascinate the fanatics of twenty century organized crime. Many believe it was because of Capone's reckless behavior that his famous nickname "Scarface" came about. Legend says that after Capone insulted a woman, he was slashed three times on the left side of his face by the woman's brother. When Capone's underlings saw his wounds, they gave him the nickname "Scarface," a name Capone loathed. However, it was the legend of "Sacrface" that led to making of one of the most famous movies ever made, using that famous nickname as the title and inspiration.

Tomorrow, many of us will go to work, and maybe your boss isn't as violent as King Nebuchadnez-zar, as impatient as George Steinbrenner or as unlawful as Al Capone, but they are definitely not a walk in the park to deal with.
