# Drawing Your Line In Sand

Two weeks ago, I began my sermon highlighting one of my favorite presidents George Washington. I expressed one of his characteristics that I admired was his ability to look beyond the moment of time he was currently in, and make decisions that would positively impact our country for generations to come.



Another one of my favorite presidents is Abraham Lincoln. When Lincoln was elected president in 1860, America was ripped apart and pitted against one another by its political leadership. The nation was split with one side calling for the abolition of slavery and the other advocating for states rights and the fate of their entire economy. Lincoln was presented with the arduous task of preserving a union that at the time could not have been more divided. At first, Lincoln, elected from the free state of Illinois, attempted to compromise with the Confederate cause, believing that the only way to preserve the United States was to not interfere with their way of life. However, when Confederate forces fired on Union troops at Fort Sumter on April 12, 1861, Lincoln drew his line in the sand. He signed the Emancipation Proclamation declaring the slaves freed in the 10 states not then under Union control. Lincoln's comment on signing the Proclamation was: "I never, in my life, felt more certain that I was doing right, than I do in signing this paper." The Northern Union eventually won the war, and on June 19th, 1865, (later referred to as Juneteenth) slavery was officially abolished in the United States.

Like Lincoln, our first inclination when presented with conflict is to tip-toe around the situation. However, while there is time and place for compromise, there are points in life where we need to stand our ground and do what's right, no matter the cost. Some of these stances may cost us friends, family or even our livelihood. However, with the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are able to discern right from wrong and trust that God will provide for us and protect us in our times of need.

In Part Two of our sermon series "Drawing Your Line In Sand" we continue our study on how Daniel, our main character, maintains his biblical integrity through his lifetime of Babylonian captivity. We can learn from Daniel on how to live a righteous life in a fallen world that wants to find every reason to persecute us.
