no Excess or Lack

This morning I wanted to look a little deeper at Paul encouraging the Corinthian church to donate money to the saints in need in. If you have the time, please read that passage now. Paul ends this section stating "at this present time your abundance being a 2 Corinthians 8:7-15 supply for their need, so that their abundance also may become a supply for your need, that there may be equality; as it is written, "He who gathered much did not have too much, and he who gathered little had no lack." [Underlining added]. The verse that Paul quotes is from Exodus 16:18 when the Hebrews were gathering manna for the first time in the wilderness.



This passage is so deep in showing the difference between Judaism and Christianity when we look into the background of what was going on. When the Hebrews first gathered the manna, they had no idea how much they would need, thus some had too much, and some had too little. God through Moses instructs the people that each person needs to have a standardized measure of manna collected, one "omer." When God gives the standardization, this verse then occurs where each person now has exactly what they need, with someone who gathered more than an omer donating it to their neighbor who hadn't gathered a full omer, so that everyone had exactly one each. Throughout the Jewish religion, everything that they did was specified, down to the amount, time, and type, but what the Lord was training them to do was to love their Lord with everything they had and their neighbor as themselves.

Today, God still expects His people, Christians, to do the same, but now the "training wheels" of all the specifics have been removed! Each person is to donate each Sunday "As they have purpose in their heart," as we read in 2 Corinthians 9:7. The Jews were given set amounts to hit in their worship - an omer for manna, a tithe (or 10%) for monetary donations but God allows us to choose what we will do. Our charge is the same as the Hebrews in the wilderness, to make sure there isn't a single needy person among us, which was the thing the first century Church did as record in Acts 2:44-45.

The Jews didn't collect more manna than they needed because it would spoil and become inedible the next day, but we can give as much as we want and know that what we donate is always going to receive an eternal reward in heaven. In fact, we are told by Paul that giving more while on earth will reap a larger reward when we are in Heaven in 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 (NASB) "Now this I say, he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.

Each one must do just as he has purposed in his heart, not grudgingly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." The Jews gave 10% when God had freed them from bondage in Egypt. How much more gratitude should we express to God for sending His Son to die on the cross to free us from the lake of fire for eternity? How much should we give to imitate our Savior, who "although He was rich, became poor for our sakes, so that through His poverty we might become rich" as we read in 2 Corinthians 8:9?
