Remembering All Jesus' Sacrifices

Each Lord's Day as we gather around the table, we commemorate Jesus the Christ, the Son of the living God. As we partake



of the bread and fruit of the vine that symbolizes His body and blood, I know my thoughts often turn to how He sacrificed both of those for our sake while on the cross of Calvary. And while the value of that sacrifice is beyond measure, if His death is all that we ever consider when we think of what Christ sacrificed for us, we run the risk of forgetting all the other things that He gave us and gave up for us.

The benevolence of Christ starts before His death, as Jesus used His whole life to show us how we should live. As our perfect example, Jesus was and is the author and perfecter of our faith as we read in *Hebrews 12:2*. Jesus' life gave us the perfect example to imitate as we live day-by-day as Paul writes in *1 Corinthians 11:1*, "Therefore be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ". He is also our example of how to overcome temptation as we are told in *Hebrews 4:15* "For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who was tempted in all ways as we are, yet without sin."

Indeed, the benevolence of Christ extends back before even His life or death, but even His existence on earth with us required sacrifice!

Remember - Jesus was, is, and always will be eternal God. We are told that Jesus is the Word of God in *John Chapter 1:1* "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Then we read in *verse 14*, "And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth." Jesus - the Word - had to humble Himself from being with God the Father to come to this planet to be with us, with *Philippians 2:6-8* telling us that Jesus "who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking on the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." The Lord Jesus allowed Himself to be humbled, allowed Himself to be made lower than the angels for a little while (*Hebrews 2:7*). Can we imagine what this was like for eternal God to do this? Jesus sacrificed His position in Heaven and His outward appearance as God to become a human, yet He willingly did this so that He could show us the perfect way to live, be tempted in all our ways without sin, and then die as the perfect sacrifice to pay for the sins that we have committed. And Jesus knew all of this before the foundation of the earth was laid! Knowing what it would cost, God still chose to make us and give us life and free will, knowing that He would suffer because of us - and our amazing God loves us anyway.

So, as we gather and remember our Lord, let us do it with all of this in mind, that Jesus sacrificed for us not just in His death, but also in His life, and before His life. Yet, He loved us so much, He willingly humbled Himself to be found in our likeness, endured our temptations to give us a perfect template for living, and then gave up His life to pay for our sins.
