The Power of a Touch

Moved with compassion, He stretched out His hand, and touched him.

Mark 1:41

Mark 1:40 describes the incident of a leper going to Jesus and begging Him to be healed. Given Christ's power to do, well, EVERYTHING, it is easy to speed past the healing of a lone leper in Mark's fast-paced gospel. Honestly, Jesus healed TEN lepers at once! From a distance! Luke 17:11 – 19. What I find incredible is the WAY Jesus healed this leper: Jesus stretched out His hand and TOUCHED him! Jesus TOUCHED him! A leper! Oh, how that touch must have felt! It was against the Law of Moses for Jepers to touch anyone because lepers were unclean. If you touched a leper, you were unclean, too. Lepers were required to warn people by shouting, "Unclean! Unclean!" so everyone could avoid them, Leviticus 13:45. Talk about social distancing! Infected with an incurable disease, isolated, and alone, Jepers suffered not only physically but also mentally and emotionally. So, when Jesus stretched out His compassionate hand to heal this leper, Jesus cured this man's disease and also healed this man's mental and emotional being.

Jesus always does things way beyond what we can even ask or think! Jesus didn't just turn water into wine. He turned water into the BEST wine! Jesus didn't just provide enough bread and fish to feed 5,000 men, not counting women and children, there were TWELVE BASKETS FULL of leftovers! Jesus didn't just heal the paralytic whose friends lowered through the roof. Jesus forgave his sins! Jesus didn't die to save His friends or family. Jesus died to save every single person who ever lived and who will ever live until the day He returns! Jesus doesn't just take care of our greatest anxieties and fears. Jesus takes care of all of our anxieties and fears no matter how great or how small! Jesus didn't die for the sins of Israel, but for the sins of the entire world since the beginning of humankind! BUT, just like the leper who went to Jesus' begging for healing, so we must go to Jesus for our healing from the otherwise incurable deadly condition which plagues all of mankind: our sin. Ask yourself, "What sin have I not yet let Jesus cleanse? What sin am I still hanging on to? What sin do I think I have under control, but I really don't?" Then, strive to give it to Jesus. Allow Jesus to touch that part of your life. Jesus can, Jesus WILL, remove it completely.
