How old do we believe the world is?

We constantly have dates and numbers from the scientific world tossed at us about fossils, carbon dating and the like,



but what does it all mean for us and how it relates to the Bible? As Christians, we believe in the unerring, perfect, inspired Word of God. We know that the Bible has recorded the genealogies and ages from when God made man on the sixth day of creation, until the birth of Jesus which we know was around 3 B.C. When we follow the totals that the Bible gives us, we come out with roughly 6,000 years of accounted history from creation until today.

But what about carbon dating? This shows that organic matter on the earth has degraded in its c-14 isotopes to the level that mathematically would equate with 13.7 billion years old. What about fossils? Don't those also show that the earth has been around far longer than 6,000 years? In short: How do we reconcile the things that we see with what we believe?

These observable traits of the world do indeed suggest a much more mature earth than one only 6,000 years old. So, let's take a look at the creation account found in Genesis and ask ourselves, "How old was Adam when God made him?" The Bible records him as the "Man" that God created in His own image, he was given a wife by God, and was able to care for himself. In the ancient Hebrew culture, a person wasn't considered "a man" until the age of thirty. So, if we use that baseline for how Adam was formed when the Holy Spirit inspired Moses to use the word "Man" in this account to describe him, we can safely estimate that Adam would have appeared to be fully mature, with a body of a thirty-year old man. Yet how old was he? He looked fully grown, had all the muscles, bones, hair, and teeth of a fully grown man, but he would have only been a few seconds old. If Adam had died after one second of life and been autopsied by a lab who would have known nothing about him, they would have seen all these physical traits of a grown man and mathematically calculated based on the rate humans develop that this was a man who had to have been born about thirty years ago to have a body which they observed to be in this state.

If God made the world and universe to be mature and able to sustain life in its function, as He did with Adam, then we should not be surprised when it appears exactly that way. If we believe biblical accounts only based on how well they coincide with what we can substantiate through observable evidence, this becomes very dangerous. We don't need to observe something to believe it, in fact, *Hebrews 11:1 (NASB)* tells us that our faith will be in what we won't observe: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Continue to have faith in the Lord, His Holy Spirit, and His Word and may the peace of God that surpasses all understanding be with you always.
